# **SLOUGH HOUSE RESERVOIR**

Some of you may have noticed new swim numbers at Slough House Reservoir. These have been put in so bailiffs can keep a record of what swims members are fishing and so we can map out the areas each swim is entitled to fish. Swim numbers 14,15 and 19 are not to be fished except in official MAS matches.



# **GUESTS/VISITORS**

Members are again reminded that you are not to have guests or visitors visit you while you are fishing unless they are a club member or have a guest ticket. Bailiffs have caught several members breaking this rule and they may receive warnings which will affect their application for a night ticket next season. Anyone collecting a member MUST wait for them in the car park and cannot walk round to meet them.

# **UNATTENDED RODS**

Members are reminded that you must not leave rods unattended and if you leave the swim for any reason then your rods MUST be reeled in.

This includes if you are fishing the same swim as another angler

We have caught several anglers breaking this rule this season.

Any member caught leaving rods unattended will face action from the Committee.

# LITTER

We have received several reports of litter being left at our lakes

This includes cigarette butts, tea bags, discarded line and tackle.

Any member caught leaving litter will face a lifetime ban from the club

# **CAR PARKS**

All cars MUST be parked in the clubs official car parks. This includes Slough House Farm where we have had cars being parked outside the gate.

We also had an incident at Little London which has prompted us to remind our members our car parks are for the following:

For MAS members and their guest ticket holders to park while fishing.

For MAS members to park while visiting the fishery to do something ancillary to fishing such as pre-baiting.

For MAS members attending a work party or other MAS event.

For use by Bailiffs and Committee members for fishery purposes.

For our landlords vehicles and their employees.

All other uses of our car parks are prohibited and will result in your number plate being noted and reported to the Committee who will make a decision about whether to pass the details onto the Police. Members are also reminded not to pass on our padlock code numbers to non-members and to close all gates and lock those that have padlocks after entry and exit.

# **UNDER 12'S**

Due to insurance regulations members under 12 years of age MUST be always accompanied by an adult member while on Society waters.

# **FISHERY MANAGEMENT**

Again, we have had an extremely busy few months with work taking place on most of our waters.

Extensive work has taken place at Slough House west with nearly all the bankside cleared, dangerous trees removed, and the island cleared. We have also started to put some fish refuges in to give the fish cover from predators. The guys who took this project on have done an amazing job and have totally transformed the fishery, well done guys. We have had Fusion landscapes in at Heron Hall to make new swims and steps. This has made a big improvement to the fishery. Graham Holmes and his team have continued their excellent work on new swims at Little London. This is making it more comfortable for people who wish to fish this great little venue. We had a large tree that had come down at Bog Grove that has now been cut and cleared. We have also increased the size of the car park at Bog Grove.

Matt Gothard from MJ Gothard construction was brought in to complete some of the trickier swims at Slough House reservoir.

Matt also came up with a solution to one of our outflow pipes which we had issues with and also done some more work on the car park. Lastly, we had an algae bloom and low oxygen problem at Slough House Reservoir. This involved us having to close the water for several days to get the pumps in the lake. Luckily things improved and we were able to reopen the lake with a minimum number of lost fish. Again, there are too many names to mention for all their hard work the last few months. I'd personally like to thank all those who have put in their own time and effort in helping make our waters better for our members to fish.

# **2025 CARP MATCHES**

### HEAT ONE – 29<sup>™</sup>/30<sup>™</sup> MARCH SLOUGH HOUSE RESERVOIR

Our first heat of the season took place slightly earlier this year at Slough House Reservoir.

We had a few last-minute dropouts which allowed us to space out the swims better which gave the anglers more room which would hopefully allow them more chance of catching.

Dean Cowell was first to catch when he landed a 16.02oz Common from one of the back swims fishing open water. Andy Thomas was off the mark shortly after when he landed a 14.04oz Mirror from close range.

Both Rob Poulton and Tony Hayden had two fish each in quick succession before Dean Cowell landed the biggest fish of the match at 22.13oz.

Oscar Crissey, Aaron Cheverall and John Godier all started to catch which made the match an exciting affair with anyone still in with a chance of winning.

In the end the match finished with Rob Poulton winning with Oscar Crissey finishing closely in second place with John Godier finishing third.

### HEAT TWO – 26TH/27<sup>™</sup> APRIL TOTHAM PIT

Our second Carp match of the season took place at Totham Pit in late April. The hopes of a good match with the chance of a few bigger fish getting caught were dashed as we suffered one of our worst ever matches. 15 Anglers fished the match and only 5 fish were caught, two of which were to the same angler.

Tony Hayden fishing in Hare's point was the first to net a fish a few hours after the start which weighed in at 16lb.13oz.

Rob Poulton was next to land a fish, a 11lb.14oz Common from Spenny's point. No other action happened until late evening with Aaron Cheverall got off the mark with a 19lb Common from the reeds 3 swim.

Just into darkness Oscar Crissey in the snag swim took the lead landing a 19lb 14oz Common from the snags swim and this was all that was caught until 6.30 on Sunday Morning.

The last fish of the match was a 15lb 06oz Common landed by Tony Hayden which gave him the win.

A very hard match on a weekend where the fish just didn't want to play ball

# **LUCY'S BOWL CHARITY**

As some of you may not be aware, our Carp matches are all in aid of the Lucy's Bowl charity. All entry fees go to this wonderful charity while our prizes in the matches are donated by tackle shops and the very generous Gary Bayes who runs Bayeswater.

### So, who are Lucy's bowl?

Lucy's Bowl is a charity that was set up in 2011 in memory of angler Keith Sykes faithful Carp Dog.

When Keith sadly lost Lucy, his rods were hung up to gather dust as fishing to him was just not the same with Lucy not being there sitting behind his rods.

At first there was an idea for Keith and his angling buddies getting together to celebrate Lucys life, Lewis Reed then comes up with the idea to hold a raffle to raise money for charity. Keiths close friend Dave Savage donated a beautiful crystal glass bowl and another friend, Roley, said he would etch a caricature of Lucys head on it....Lucy's Bowl was created.

That first meet was at Little Horseshoe Lake with Pete Bond becoming the first winner of the Bowl.

That first event raised £1100, and the amount was also matched by a company of one of the anglers taking part. A decision then was to be made of who

was going to receive the proceeds of the first Lucys Bowl match.

When Keith had adopted Lucy at fourteen months old it was through two close friends Bonnie and Bob who were actively involved with The guide dogs for the blind association. It was decided that this was the charity that the proceeds would go to. Every two hours in the UK someone will become visually impaired which will change their life drastically. Each working guide dog will cost in the region of £55000 from its birth right through to its retirement, which is around 8 years.

Since that first Lucy's Bowl event in 2011 an event is held every year, and it has grown massively with an event happening every summer.

### FISHERY IN FOCUS - SLOUGH HOUSE WEST

Slough House West is a small reservoir of around 1 1/2 acres with an island. The lake is fairly shallow with depths of around 3-4 feet. There has been extensive work the last six months by a dedicated team, and they have totally transformed the fishery.

Large amounts of trees and snags have been removed to make the lake much safer to fish.

Lillies have been planted along with reeds to improve the venue even more. With so many marginal snags removed the team have installed some fish refuges to give the fish cover from predators.

Slough House West holds a good stock of Carp with a couple scraping the 20lb mark, most fish are around 8 to 12lb. There is also a good stock of Roach, Rudd and Bream up to around 5lb. Tench can also be found up to 4lb with the odd Perch also present.

This water also contains a large abundance of Eels up to 3lb.

Fishing round the island can be the most productive but very good bags of Bream have come from open water.

# **LEPTOSPIROSIS**

Although Weils disease is extremely rare it is something all anglers should be aware of. Weils disease (Leptospirosis) can be a serious illness requiring hospital treatment and can lead to kidney and liver failure. It is a bacterial infection that is carried in Rat urine which contaminates water and the banks of rivers and lakes. One patient in 19 dies from it. The most common symptoms are a temperature, an influenza-like illness with severe headaches, sometimes meningitis and joint muscle pains (pains in the calf muscles are often particularly noticeable). These symptoms normally start 3 to 19 days after exposure to contaminated water and if caught early it can be treated.

If you show any of the symptoms after fishing, then please tell your doctor you may have been exposed to Leptospirosis so they can consider this as a diagnosis.

### What precautions to take:

Cover any cuts, sores or scratches with waterproof plasters or use gloves.

Disinfect any wounds that occur at the waterside.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Do not put your hands in your mouth after immersing in water.

Never place bait or fishing line in your mouth

Never leave food on the floor and always cover or wrap it.

# Protect fisheries by disinfecting your angling equipment

### Equipment is a big risk in transferring diseases

England and Wales has over 10,000 registered fisheries and 1 million regular anglers. One of the biggest threats to the angling industry is the transfer of disease between fisheries through fish movements or equipment.

Fishery managers can only do so much to reduce the risk of disease transmission and the spread of non-native species between fisheries, so anglers must do all they can to safeguard the future of their sport.

It has been proven that angling equipment poses a major risk in the transfer of diseases between fisheries. A recent Cefas experiment found that nets infected with KHV spread the disease to healthy fish. Other studies have found a range of fish pathogens and invasive species can also be spread by angling equipment.

Critically, once diseases are present in a fishery they are often impossible to treat. They have a detrimental effect to fish populations and the wider aquatic ecosystem. Therefore preventing the spread of diseases is vital to safeguard the fisheries industry.

You can help by using disinfectant to thoroughly disinfect your equipment between angling trips. This kills disease pathogens which stops the spread of disease. If you cannot use chemical disinfectants, you can dry and expose your equipment to UV light when at home. But this is not as reliable as the use of disinfectant and may not kill all disease pathogens.



### What equipment to disinfect

It's not always practical to disinfect all your equipment so focus on the items which are high risk, especially those that touch fish or water.

Therefore check, clean, disinfect and dry:

- landing nets
- keep nets
- unhooking mats
- boots
- weigh slings

This helps stop your equipment spreading water, pathogens, or animals between fisheries.
