We are still finding dangerous "Death rigs" including the one below that was found in a tree at a recent Work party at Slough House Farm. With this rig, the solid bag stem is being used with the incorrect type of lead. In the event of a line breakage the lead would stay attached to the hooklink.

INTRODUCING KEVIN ACRES

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to all members who may not know me or have not yet had the chance to meet me. I'd also like to share a little about my background and lifelong passion for fishing.

Fishing has been a central part of my life for as long as I can remember. As a child and well into my thirties, I lived for fishing. Every school holiday and weekend during the season was spent by the water. My journey began when my father would take me to Danbury Lakes on Saturday mornings. We would arrive before dawn, set up by torchlight, and start fishing. While we didn't always catch much, I was completely hooked from the start.

During my early teens, a school friend introduced me to the reservoir at Brock Farm, which was less than a mile from where I lived. At the time, it was filled with crucians-though not true cruciansand it quickly became a favourite spot. I later joined Does Angling Club and spent several years fishing what is now known as Number One Reservoir before the second reservoir was constructed. Over the years, I have also been a member of Chelmsford, Marconi, Mid Essex, CAPS, and Maldon Angling Association. As a youngster, my primary interest was matchstyle fishing. However, after starting work and making friends with other anglers, I was persuaded to try carp fishing. I gave it a go for a few years until one particular experience at Layer Pit changed my approach. A fellow angler, fishing a match-style setup, was catching carp consistently while we struggled. That moment reignited my passion for match-style fishing, which I have continued ever since-though primarily for pleasure.

I also spent a great deal of time fishing the River Chelmer, particularly at Paper Mill Weir Pool and Hoe Mill Pool, often staying out until midnight with a swing tip, catching roach, bream, and Tench. Later, I took up pike fishing with friends, frequenting Abberton, Alton Water Reservoir, Totham Pit, and the Chelmer. However, as family and work commitments grew, my fishing trips became less frequent. During this time, I also developed an interest in radio-controlled model aeroplanes, which occupied much of my free time.

At 54, I fulfilled a long-time ambition of obtaining my motorcycle license, and to this day, I still enjoy riding. However, I always knew that when I retired, I would return to my first love—fishing. Three years ago, at the age of 64, I rejoined Maldon Angling Association and resumed regular fishing. For a period, I played guitar in a band, The Noisy Neighbours, but eventually decided to focus entirely on fishing, which had always been my retirement plan.



Through social media, I connected with Julian Jordan and Kelvin Willis, which led me to participate in the President's Cup Match at Slough last year—my first proper match in over 45 years. I thoroughly enjoyed it and have since been actively participating in both club and concessionary matches. For anyone interested in joining the club or concessionary matches but feeling unsure about their skill level or whether they'll fit in—please don't worry! The anglers are incredibly friendly and supportive. The goal is to enjoy fishing, keep improving, and most importantly, have fun. Finally, I'd like to express my sincere gratitude to all the match anglers—both senior and concessionary—for their warm welcome, encouragement, and camaraderie. It has meant a great deal to me. I'd also like to thank all the other anglers I have met so far, regardless of their fishing style—be it carp fishing, pleasure fishing, or match fishing. The sense of community and shared passion for the sport is truly inspiring.

I look forward to seeing you all by the water.

GUESTS/VISITORS

Please remember Members are not to have visitors or guests on our waters unless they are a Member, a Non-Fishing member or have a guest ticket. Anyone caught at our lakes who does not have a membership or guest ticket will be asked to leave and the member they are with will be reported to the Committee.

If you require anything brought down to you while you are fishing, then you must reel your rods in and meet them at the gate.

UNATTENDED RODS

Members are reminded of rule 5.13 that Fishing hook bait must be removed from the water when the swim is vacated for any reason. This includes popping to the next swim to visit another member. We are increasingly finding members sitting in another swim while their rods are still out.

Leaving rods unattended will result in a 3-month ban.

As a club we want to protect our stocks and leaving rods risks fish getting tethered up.

FISHERY MANAGEMENT

We have had a very busy and productive few months with work parties on Totham pit, Bog Grove, Slough house Farm and Rook Hall. Our first work party was on January 19th at Totham pit where we had an amazing 18 people turning up to help out. We had three swims completely rebuilt, blue dye being added, a number of underwater snags removed, some dangerous and awkward trees cut down, bush trimming, new signage and lily's being planted at Bog Grove. Also thankyou to Peter Garrett for making us all a great lunch.



















The 9th February saw our next work party taking place at Bog Grove. The main aim of this work party was to deal with the massive willow trees that had fallen in the lake. We managed to pull the trees out, repair damaged swims, cut and log most of the willow, burn most of the brush, had a good strim, put up new signage and mark out where the car park will be.















The North side of the island has also been cleared of the snags that had become a big problem and will now allow anglers to fish in a much safer manner.

Swim work is continuing and hopefully soon all swims will have protection with boards.











Saturday 1st March saw us have a Work party at Rook Hall with loads of trees trimmed, 2nd dose of blue dye and an amazing amount of weed removed. We did see lots of juvenile fish in the weed, Tench, Rudd, Perch and Carp so the future does look bright for this fishery. We will be looking at holding more Work parties here over once the banks dry out to remove more weed.













As you can see, we have had a very busy few months in making our waters better for our members to fish. I cannot thank those who turn up to our work parties enough. Far too many names for me to mention but you know who you are. Without your help this work would not get done and myself, the whole Committee and no doubt our members really appreciate you giving up your time to help.

FISHERY IN FOCUS – LITTLE LONDON RESERVIOR

Little London is a small reservoir of around two acres situated just outside Goldhanger. It is reed and tree lined which accounts for some great margin fishing. Little London at times can prove to be a bit difficult but there are some stunning fish for those who are patient. The Bream in Little London go into double figures with Tench, Rudd, Roach, Crucians and Perch also stocked. Pike are also present with a few into low doubles, but mainly small jacks can be found. There are also a few big Eels. The Carp fishing in Little London can at times prove to be a challenge but the fish are worth the wait. The Carp go up to midtwenties, these are mainly Commons with just a handful of Mirrors present. Little London does seem to fish better when the banks are quiet so if you do give it a go then try to keep any disturbance to a minimum.

Over the last year or so there has been a lot of work on the swims that is ongoing to make the venue a lot more comfortable for members to fish.

Although Weils disease is extremely rare it is something all anglers should be aware of. Weils disease (Leptospirosis) can be a serious illness requiring hospital treatment and can lead to kidney and liver failure. It is a bacterial infection that is carried in Rat urine which contaminates water and the banks of rivers and lakes. One patient in 19 dies from it. The most common symptoms are a temperature, an influenza-like illness with severe headaches, sometimes meningitis and joint muscle pains (pains in the calf muscles are often particularly noticeable). These symptoms normally start 3 to 19 days after exposure to contaminated water and if caught early it can be treated.

If you show any of the symptoms after fishing, then please tell your doctor you may have been exposed to Leptospirosis so they can consider this as a diagnosis.

What precautions to take:

Cover any cuts, sores or scratches with waterproof plasters or use gloves.

Disinfect any wounds that occur at the waterside.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Do not put your hands in your mouth after immersing in water.

Never place bait or fishing line in your mouth

Never leave food on the floor and always cover or wrap it.

Protect fisheries by disinfecting your angling equipment

Equipment is a big risk in transferring diseases

England and Wales has over 10,000 registered fisheries and 1 million regular anglers. One of the biggest threats to the angling industry is the transfer of disease between fisheries through fish movements or equipment.

Fishery managers can only do so much to reduce the risk of disease transmission and the spread of non-native species between fisheries, so anglers must do all they can to safeguard the future of their sport.

It has been proven that angling equipment poses a major risk in the transfer of diseases between fisheries. A recent Cefas experiment found that nets infected with KHV spread the disease to healthy fish. Other studies have found a range of fish pathogens and invasive species can also be spread by angling equipment.

Critically, once diseases are present in a fishery they are often impossible to treat. They have a detrimental effect to fish populations and the wider aquatic ecosystem. Therefore preventing the spread of diseases is vital to safeguard the fisheries industry.

You can help by using disinfectant to thoroughly disinfect your equipment between angling trips. This kills disease pathogens which stops the spread of disease. If you cannot use chemical disinfectants, you can dry and expose your equipment to UV light when at home. But this is not as reliable as the use of disinfectant and may not kill all disease pathogens.



What equipment to disinfect

It's not always practical to disinfect all your equipment so focus on the items which are high risk, especially those that touch fish or water.

Therefore check, clean, disinfect and dry:

- landing nets
- keep nets
- unhooking mats
- boots
- weigh slings

This helps stop your equipment spreading water, pathogens, or animals between fisheries.
