SWANS KILLED BY ANGLERS ON CHELMER AND BLACKWATER CANAL

We received a sad report from the IWA Essex Waterways that a Cob swan (male) and one of the Cygnets were beaten to death with paddles by two men fishing from inflatables at the Hoe Mill stretch of the Chelmer and Blackwater canal.

Intentionally killing, injuring or taking a wild Swan without a licence is an offence under the wildlife and countryside act 1981. The maximum penalty for a conviction is six months in prison and/or an unlimited fine. WATER CLOSURES

Members are reminded to check their Rule book or the club website for water closures before setting off to fish to avoid disappointment. We have had anglers turning up at lakes unaware of closures.

MOVING FISH

Members must not move fish between our waters, this includes between lakes at Rook Hall. Anyone caught moving fish of any type will be dealt with by the Committee. Any movements of any fish involving our lakes can only be done by our Fishery management team.

HANDLING FISH

An angler was recently seen by a committee member at Slough House Farm carrying a large Carp back to the water in his arms.

The member in question was educated at the dangers of carrying a fish in this way. Carrying a fish this way could result in serious injury or even death to the fish if it is dropped.

ALWAYS CARRY A FISH BACK TO THE WATER IN A SLING, RETAINER, UNHOOKING MAT OR YOUR LANDING NET

NIGHT PERMITS

Members are reminded that a night permit is required to fish our waters. A member was recently caught fishing at night without a night permit at Slough house reservoir and to make matters worse he had two Non members spend the night with him. The member in question has received a year long ban and also a two-year suspension from applying for future night membership.

NON-MEMBERS/GUESTS

Please remember that guests are not allowed to visit you on our waters unless they are full members, have a guest ticket or a Non fishing membership and this includes children. It has been noted anglers are giving out the gate code to Nonmembers to visit them while they are fishing which is breaking our rules. Anyone caught doing this will face disciplinary action from the Committee. This rule was brought into place for insurance purposes and to stop members inviting Non-members on to our lakes. Non-fishing memberships are available for anyone wanting to visit while you are fishing.

If you wish to have a guest with you while you fish, then you can purchase a guest ticket for them, or they can purchase a Non fishing membership but please note they are NOT ALLOWED to spend the night with you.

UNSAFE RIGS

We have recently had reports of unsafe death rigs being found at some of our waters. In this day and age this shouldn't be possible with all the information available on the Internet. The most common type of rig that does get found involves the lead being unable to come off if a line breakage occurs. Our bailiffs will be carrying out rig checks on our waters. Please if anyone is in doubt of a rig being safe then contact a member of the Committee or a bailiff for advice.





The top rig contains a short stiff part of the rig which is attached to around a centimetre of supple braid. The braid is then tied to a wire trace. The bottom rig contains a length of tubing that goes right up to the hook. This was then attached to a fixed lead which had no way of freeing itself from the line.

The anglers fishing the open water were really struggling and were hoping the fish would move down during darkness, but this never happened. The only other angler other than John Godier to catch during the night was Anthony Chamberlain in the Car park swim.

Sunday morning saw John Godier continue to catch with Dean Farmer adding a few more fish to his total. Paul Brazier landed a couple of fish along with another fish for John Guest and one for Tony Hayden.

FISHERY IN FOCUS – SLOUGH HOUSE RESERVIOR

Slough house farm reservoir is around 5 acres with extensive reed beds and a tree lined island at one end of the lake. The lake is surrounded by a small menagerie on most banks with its livestock known to have kept Anglers entertained on occasions.

Slough house contains Carp of all sizes up to upper twenties along with good sized Roach and Rudd to keep the float and feeder Anglers occupied. There is also Tench to over 6lb and skimmers up to the occasional big bream of over 8lb. There are also Eels to over 4lb and if you are lucky enough you may have one of the remaining Ide which go to around 4lb.

Slough house is one of the most popular of all our waters with match and pleasure weights of 50lb plus a regular occurrence.

The Carp fishing can also be pretty hectic at times with multiple catches very common and Anglers can expect multiple runs if the location and tactics are correct.

Most tactics and methods work well on Slough house, but the feeder and method are very common.

For the Carp, everything seems to work if you are on the fish, but beds of particle and pellet do seem popular.

Although the Island and open water do seem very popular never ignore the margins, especially the reeds as big hits of fish do come from very close in.

As Slough house is probably our most productive water for all species it can at times get busy, but this is only because of the superb fishing that can be had.

We did undertake a netting last winter to remove a number of the small Carp to improve the fishing and this does seem to have made a difference with the average size of fish now larger.

MY LOVE OF VINTAGE TACKLE

I was born in 1965 and started fishing in the early 1970's with a gang of my mates in a little village called Bengeo on top of a hill near Hertford the County town of Hertfordshire. Hertford was blessed with being the confluence of a number of fine rivers including the Lea, Mimram, Beane, Ash and Rib and I cut my angling teeth cycling to these rivers but mostly to Hartham Common and the Meads where we trotted for Dace, Chub, Perch and Roach. Angling life was simpler then, if it was 9ft long it was a ledger rod, 13ft a float rod, specimen rods were 11ft and as for test curves 1lb meant it was an Avon, 1.5 to 1.75lb a carp rod, 2.5lb a stepped-up carp road and 2.75lb and over it was for Pike. Yes, there were variants, and you cannot believe the envy generated when my mate acquired a 14lb green float rod. Most rods were glassfibre and a cane rod was usually a hand me down from a family member or neighbour. Reels were dominated by Mitchell with the 300 being the standard specimen reel and if you had an Abu Cardinal 55 you were considered a proper carp angler.

How times have changed and walking into most tackle shops you are now faced with a vast array of different rods, reels and tackle sundries for every eventuality.

You will have noticed that I sometimes refer to myself as Kid Vintage and while I do have a vast array of modern fishing equipment, I still hold special the type of gear I grew up fishing with and older gear made before I was born.

I did go through the phase back then of thinking older gear was past its best and yes, I upgraded to carbon for most of my rods but recently I have regained the love of vintage and have started to collect

and more importantly use vintage fishing gear. It really re-started for me when I acquired a handmade Richard Walker MkIV carp rod made by Chapmans of Ware and Nic Lindsell very kindly gave me a Mitchell 300 half bale reel that were a perfect match. I had also acquired a donkey top ledger rod by Ernest Stamford and a Mitchell 204. More Mitchells followed to include a 300a 300s, 206, 208 and 3330Z, plus a few centrepins. Then I remembered I used to use an Avon rod back in the 70's and 80's with a leaping Perch as its logo and found that these were made by ET Barlow & Sons of Thames Ditton. He made replicas of more expensive rods like the Hardy Trotter of 11ft 6 but his was just called Trotter and was 11ft 4. I found an Aurora Carp and Avon Supreme under his Vortex brand. All were Vortex rods but were given a different name like Kennet, Trotter, Aurora and Avon



I now consider anything before the year 2000 as vintage so I have a few Abu Cardinal GT's from the 80's as these were the Abu version of a free-spool back then including two large 656BW's with BW standing for Big Water, the 80's version of the Big Pit reels we see today.

I think my favourite item is an Efgeeco tackle carrier, a bit like the one I actually had in the 70's and I use it now on most of my general fishing trips.

Last year I bought a Bruce and Walker MkIV carp rod from someone in Hertfordshire, and he recommended me to join the Crabtree Society, a Facebook Group dedicated to the name of one of the angling greats Bernard Venables who wrote Mr Crabtree Goes Fishing, a book I grew up reading. This group celebrates all things vintage and traditional, and I am also a member of their Essex and Hertfordshire Groups who organise fishing trips all over the South East and east Anglia areas of this country. It's a great group and a real chance to see vintage gear being used, even cane rod rests. I would recommend to anyone to get into a bit of vintage and either dig out that old rod that is in the back of the garage or look in charity shops and on Ebay, you will be surprised at what you find and how it is still a joy to use.

CHELMER AND BLACKWATER NAVIGATION RULES

- 1) Anglers must comply with Environment Agency bylaws & hold a valid rod licence for the number of rods in use.
- 2) Close season applies 15th March to 15th June inclusive.
- 3) Anglers using the Chelmer & Blackwater Navigation do so at their own risk Maldon Angling Society accepts no responsibility or liability for the loss of, or damage to any tackle, property, or personal possessions.
- 4) Anglers are responsible both for keeping their swim and surrounding area free from litter.
- 5) Anglers must not dig swims into the bank.
- 6) No angler is permitted to kill or take away any fish.7) No fish to be kept in captivity for longer that 6 hours and any fish showing signs or distress should be returned immed
- 8) No fires are allowed on the ban
- 9) Where a match is advertised, the stretch of water will be closed for fishing from both banks for 2 hours before and 1 hour after the match.
- 10) The use of live baits is not permitted.
- 11) Anglers fishing for Carp and Pike must use an unhooking mat.
- 12)Hooks and bait must be removed from the water if the swim is left for any reason.
- 13)Carp sacks are not to be used & Carp over 5lbs will not be retained by any method, except during officially booked match
- 14)Anglers must be in possession of a suitably sized landing net.
- 15)No fishing within 30 meters of any lock, nor within 15 meters of any bridge, weir, wharf, landing stage, permanent mooring, or any other navigational structure.
- 16)No fishing on that part of the waterway just above Daisy meadow car park & **Heybridge Basin.**
- 17) No fishing between Paper Mill Road bridge & the upstream end of the towpath moorings at papermill.
- 18)No fishing on the waterway adjacent to Treasure Island at Little Baddow.
- 19)No fishing on the part of waterway adjacent to the south bank between Hall bridge Heybridge & Heybridge Basin.
- 20)No angler is to be inconsiderate or abusive towards other users of the Chelmer and Blackwater Navigation.
- 21) Anglers must not obstruct the towpath.

LEPTOSPIROSIS

Although Weils disease is extremely rare it is something all anglers should be aware of. Weils disease (Leptospirosis) can be a serious illness requiring hospital treatment and can lead to kidney and liver failure. It is a bacterial infection that is carried in Rat urine which contaminates water and the banks of rivers and lakes. One patient in 19 dies from it. The most common symptoms are a temperature, an influenza-like illness with severe headaches, sometimes meningitis and joint muscle pains (pains in the calf muscles are often particularly noticeable). These symptoms normally start 3 to 19 days after exposure to contaminated water and if caught early it can be treated.

If you show any of the symptoms after fishing, then please tell your doctor you may have been exposed to Leptospirosis so they can consider this as a diagnosis.

What precautions to take:

Cover any cuts, sores or scratches with waterproof plasters or use gloves.

Disinfect any wounds that occur at the waterside.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Do not put your hands in your mouth after immersing in water.

Never place bait or fishing line in your mouth

Never leave food on the floor and always cover or wrap it.



Protect fisheries by disinfecting your angling equipment

Equipment is a big risk in transferring diseases

England and Wales has over 10,000 registered fisheries and 1 million regular anglers. One of the biggest threats to the angling industry is the transfer of disease between fisheries through fish movements or equipment.

Fishery managers can only do so much to reduce the risk of disease transmission and the spread of non-native species between fisheries, so anglers must do all they can to safeguard the future of their sport.

It has been proven that angling equipment poses a major risk in the transfer of diseases between fisheries. A recent Cefas experiment found that nets infected with KHV spread the disease to healthy fish. Other studies have found a range of fish pathogens and invasive species can also be spread by angling equipment.

Critically, once diseases are present in a fishery they are often impossible to treat. They have a detrimental effect to fish populations and the wider aquatic ecosystem. Therefore preventing the spread of diseases is vital to safeguard the fisheries industry.

You can help by using disinfectant to thoroughly disinfect your equipment between angling trips. This kills disease pathogens which stops the spread of disease. If you cannot use chemical disinfectants, you can dry and expose your equipment to UV light when at home. But this is not as reliable as the use of disinfectant and may not kill all disease pathogens.



What equipment to disinfect

It's not always practical to disinfect all your equipment so focus on the items which are high risk, especially those that touch fish or water.

Therefore check, clean, disinfect and dry:

- landing nets
- keep nets
- unhooking mats
- boots
- weigh slings

This helps stop your equipment spreading water, pathogens, or animals between fisheries.
